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As the Executive Director of Treatment Trends, Inc. (TTI), I am pleased to announce exciting changes to our residential treatment program (formally known as Keenan House). It has a new name: **TTI Allentown Residential**. The new name is part of a larger branding initiative honoring TTI's long history while embracing myriad changes in drug and alcohol treatment, including Medication Assisted Treatment.

Along with its new name, TTI Allentown Residential has transformed to align with ASAM Level 3.5 to provide individualized services. The Therapeutic Community model has been retired. Our program operates in three phases: Stabilization, Communication & Support, and includes Relapse Prevention. The phases offer different levels of support with the goal of completing the program and transitioning into the next level of treatment on a strong, stable pathway to recovery.

A major element in our new TTI Allentown Residential programming is the termination of our contract with the PA Department of Corrections. TTI Allentown Residential is not a Department of Corrections contracted facility. This has opened up more opportunities in programming and flexibility to serve our clients based on their individual needs.

Although we no longer contract with the PA Department of Corrections, we maintain our relationships with county prisons as well as probation and parole. Our staff is particularly passionate about working with individuals coming to treatment through the criminal justice system.
