Treatment Trends (TTI) provides Case Management and Peer Recovery Support Services for participants in Northampton County TCAP. The services are separate, although staff operates as a team.

## ELIGIBILITY

Eligible individuals must be a Lehigh or Northampton County resident, depending on their program, over the age of 18 with alcohol or other drug dependencies. Individuals must meet a level 2, 3 or 4 as defined by the Pennsylvania Commission on Sentencing with court approval and voluntary consent to participate.

TCAP is available to all qualifying individuals regardless of age, race, creed, sex, ethnicity, color, national origin, marital status, sexual orientation, handicap, or religion.

Individuals with a history of arson, sex offense(s), violence separate from drug/alcohol use, un-managed or unstable psychiatric/medical conditions (including detox), and/or an I.Q. lower than 75 are *not* eligible to participate.

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TCAP is funded by Pennsylvania Commission on Crime & Delinquency (PCCD) and Lehigh and Northampton County Drug & Alcohol Commissions.

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## CONTINUUM PROCESS



Participants have the opportunity to identify personal goals as they transition through the treatment continuum. Participants must secure independent living in Lehigh or Northampton County, depending on their program, and must remain in that County through the entirety of their TCAP sentence. Participants will continue to work through the continuum as they attend Intensive Outpatient (IOP) or Outpatient (OP) Services.

## PHILOSOPHY

TCAP is enhanced by an effective treatment team that includes a physician, psychiatrist, licensed social worker, professional counselors, case manager, and probation officer dedicated to working with the offender through the entire diversionary sentence.

The team is trained in addictions, co-occurring disorders, and criminality, and utilizes best practices to optimize outcomes such as: increased insight to intervene in personal relapse patterns, addictive, and criminal lifestyles; increased impulse control and prosocial behaviors; improved self image and coping skills; healthier interpersonal relationships; drug, crime, and violence free lifestyles.
